Senator, 2013 - 2024
Appointed by Stephen Harper

Signatory to a letter from JCCC to Party Secretary of Jiangsu Province in 2020, pledging continued support of the "great motherland"

Oh gave Jiang a King's medal

President of JCCC

Overseas Representative of the Jiangsu Provincial Committee of the CPPCC
Vice President of the Jiangsu Province Overseas Friendship Association



Michael Chan 陳國治
Deputy Mayor of Markham, ON
Liberal MPP, Markham-Unionville (2007 - 2018)

Served in cabinet under ON Premiers McGuinty & Wynne

Pivotal fundraiser for both the federal & Ontario Liberals

2019: Governor of Seneca College when foreign students were bused from Seneca's dorm to vote at Han Dong's nomination (Seneca also refused to show its CI contract to media in 2020)

2013/2014: Facilitated Toronto School Board's CI contract with the PRC

Close to & shared the same constituency with John McCallum, Markham-Unionville former MP

Honorary Citizen of Jiangsu Province, Honorary chair of JCCC

2020: Co-signed a JCCC letter to Jiangsu Province Party Secretary, pledging continued support of the "great motherland"

CSIS's leaked doc alleged Chan had close tie with & provided political info to the Toronto PRC Consulate; offered to verbally attack other MPPs re PRC human rights issues; & likely orchestrated a smearing campaign to replace MP Geng Tan with Han Dong

2010: CSIS warned Ontario govt but dismissed

Chan sued Globe & Mail for reporting on CSIS leaked documents

Chan as Ng's re-election campaign co-chair but bowed out due to public outcry

Kathleen Wynne
Premier of Ontario (2013 - 2018)

Strongly defended Michael Chan & dismissed CSIS's concerns as baseless in 2015

When CCP's Party Secretary of Jiangsu Province Luo Zhijun (羅志軍) visited in 2015, Wynne agreed to a closed door meeting, & banned reporters when she spoke alongside Luo at the opening of the Industrial Cooperation Forum in Toronto & at a 30th anniversary celebration for the Ontario-Jiangsu Friendship Agreement

Wynne was unable to explain why she agreed to the requests to ban the media from what would normally be public events in Ontario.

Dalton McGuinty
Premier of Ont. (2003 - 2013)

2010 CSIS officially warned McGuinty's govt about Michael Chan but dismissed as baseless

His brother is David McGuinty (LIB MP since 2004) Minister of Public Safety, Chair (2017-2024) of National Security & Intelligence Committee (NSICOP), which oversees Canadian intelligence services

Justin Trudeau
PM: 2015 - 2025 (LPC)

Said he admired China's basic dictatorship

Claims there are "many inaccuracies" in the leaked CSIS documents about PRC's attempts to influence the 2021 federal election, but was unable to clarify which information was inaccurate

Appointed Woo to senate

Yuen Pau Woo 胡元豹
Appointed Senator in 2016 by Justin Trudeau

Said his senate job is to help parliament understand China correctly & to help China achieve its world leader ambition

Promised to shield CCP front group members from critical scrutiny in Canada for taking pro-PRC stances

His submissions to the Hogue FI Inquiry discredit CSIS intelligence work as biased & racist

Han Dong 董哈鹏
MP of Don Valley North, Ont. (2019 - 2025)

Elected MP as Liberal, later sat as independent due to leaked CSIS documents

2019: About 48 hours before the federal election nomination deadline, CSIS urged Trudeau's team to rescind Dong's candidacy

2019: CSIS alleged Dong was one of at least 11 Toronto-area candidates supported by Beijing in the election, & believes Dong is a witting affiliate in the PRC's election interference networks

2021: CSIS intercepted a conversation where Dong secretly advised a PRC diplomat to delay freeing the two Michaels because it would benefit the CPC in the election

CSIS alleged Dong is a close friend of the PRC Toronto Consulate & a close contact of Michael Chan, and Chinese international students with fake addresses were bused in from Seneca's dorm and coerced to vote for Dong's Liberal nomination

CSIS also alleged Dong meeting with a senior official from Beijing's United Front Work Department in New York state

Mary Ng (LIB MP 2017-2025) Elected in Markham-Thornhill after John McCallum resigned

Several cabinet positions under PMJT: International Trade, Export Promotion & Small Business

Worked in the Privy Council & PMO before politics

2019: Michael Chan as her re-election campaign co-chair but bowed out due to public outcry

2019: Accused of "tone deaf" to the two Michaels' plight when eating ice cream on a trade promotion trip in Beijing

2019 - 2020: Ethics breach by awarding contracts to her friend's PR firm

Marianne Situ 司徒完滿
Former federal govt chief interpreter & held top secret clearance

Accused G&M & western media being racist in an open letter

Said there's no PRC interference in her submission to the Hogue Inquiry

Has been campaigning against a foreign agent registry

Stephen Siu 蕭顯揚
Former assistant director of HK Economic & Trade Office in Canada (HKETO) from 2004 - 2013

Kenny Zhang 張康清
Former director of business development at HQ Vancouver when Woo was president

Facilitated in bringing Poly Culture to Vancouver, helped to establish the first foothold for PLA linked China Poly Group in North America

Alexa Loo 羅仙泳
Former Olympic athlete & city councillor of Richmond BC

Enjoys the front row seat with the Chinese consul-general when attending community events

Attended pro-CCP group leaders' private party & danced to music praising Mao Zedong

Told Phoenix TV that athletes shouldn't criticize a foreign govt's human rights record

Xixi Li 李西西
Brossard city councillor, Quebec

Executive director of the Chinese family service of Greater Montréal & the Sino-Quebec Centre

Both groups have been investigated by RCMP, suspected to be secret Chinese Police Stations

Li, supported by Woo, is suing the RCMP for defamation

Niu, Hua 牛华
President of CCSA
Received two Queen's medals, both from Oh

Bai, Jiping 白计平 aka Richter Bai
Vice-president of CCSA
Received medals from both Oh & Han (three in total)

Chen, Yongtao 陈永涛
Former Executive Chair of CACA
Received one Queen's & one King's medal, both from Oh

Pu, Xiang 普翔
Founding President of CCSA

Wang, Dianqi 王典奇
Former Executive Chair of CACA

Chen, Mailin 陈脉林
Former PRC Congress member
Former member of the CPPCC
A real estate developer who was found to have violated B.C. foreign buyers tax regulations

Pan, Miaofei 潘妙飞
Past Executive Chair of CACA
Hosted controversial private fundraising event in his mansion for PMJT

Zhang, Jiawei 張家衛
Co-chair of Chinese Canadian Heritage & Future Foundation (CCHFF)

Xue, Xiaomei 薛晓梅
Chair of CACA
Former chair of SiChuan Friendship Association (CSCFA), an organization received certification from the Sichuan provincial govt

Kong, Qingcun 孔庆存
Co-founder of Chinese Canadian Society for Political Engagement (CCSPE) 加拿大華人參政議政促進投票聯盟
Founding director of CCHFF

Peter Fu 傅宾清
Executive president of CCSA



Accused CSIS documents of inaccuracies

Canadian Security Intelligence Service

Accused CSIS being biased & racist

In 2010, dismissed CSIS's warning about Chen as baseless

Strongly defended Chan & dismissed CSIS's concerns as baseless
