Leadership vetted by PRC consulate
Claimed the Chinese diaspora is responsible for defending the PRC's territorial integrity
Supported HK govt & police's clamp-down on protestors
Supported the HK NSL
Claimed the PRC's breach of the Sino-British Joint Declaration was an internal affair

CACA & other known pro-Beijing groups were key participants & supporters

100th anniversary of the 1923 Chinese Exclusion Act

Co-organized by Victor Oh, Yuen Pau Woo & ACCT Foundation
Events included a ceremony at the Senate Hall, a rally marching to the official anthem of the CCP military towards Parliament Hill, an exhibition, a commemorative plaque, a movie & a forum
The events were used to oppose the proposed FI registry legislation, labelled "Exclusion 2.0"

Online petition against Global News & Sam Cooper

May 1, 2020, Xiaobei Chen kickstarted the campaign against Global News & Cooper
"To press Global News to retract two reports against Chinese Canadians and to apologize"
The petition was reported by PRC state media China News (中國新聞網) & Argentina Chinese media

Wrote an open letter to Globe & Mail, accusing G&M & mainstream media being racist against Chinese

Open letter to Globe & Mail

Blaming G&M not to publish a petition written by Xiaobei Chen & others, accusing former ambassador David Mulroney being racist towards Yuen Pau Woo
Situ's open letter also accused mainstream media of "hyping up hate speeches of various anti-China, insulting-Chinese & anti-Chinese organizations advocating various separatist movements & challenging the territorial integrity of China"

Featured in PRC museums & state media
Paintings prominently exhibited and promoted by the CCP

Situ, Qiao 司徒乔 (MS's grandfather)
Paintings prominently exhibited and promoted by the CCP
Chengzhi Liu (廖承志), a founding figure of CCP's UFWD strategy, and a long-time head of OCAO, wrote a foreword for Situ Qiao's book

Situ, Jie 司徒杰 (MS's great uncle)
PRC sculptor who did the Bethune statue in Montreal, a project commissioned by the PRC govt & donated to the City of Montreal in 1978

Situ, Shuang 司徒双 (MS's mother)
A French language prof. at Beijing Foreign Studies U, the "cradle of PRC diplomats"

Engaged in ambassadorial spouse diplomacy during her husband's tenure as PRC Ambassador to Morocco from 1987 to 1993

Marianne Situ (MS)

Last name changed from Wan (完) to Situ (司徒) in order to get into the most elite school for 'CCP leaders' kids, Shi Jia Hutong Elementary School (史家胡同小學)

Circa Aug/Sept 1989
Was able to exit the PRC soon after the Tiananmen Massacre to study at Carleton University in Canada

1994
MS became Canadian citizen

1995
MS & JL got married

JL became Canadian citizen through spousal sponsorship



Marianne Situ (MS) 司徒完满

Held top secret clearance for 25+ yrs until 2024

Former Chief interpreter (Chinese/English/French) & senior interpreter for Indigenous Languages Interpretation Services
Translated for 4 governor generals & 3 PMs including JC, SH & JT

Worked as on-site co-ordinator in the Parliament on a daily basis

Dec 2024: Claimed she had applied for federal roles including chief commissioner of Canadian Human Rights Commission, board director of National Council for Reconciliation, & board trustee of national museums.

Canada-China Art Association (CCAA) 加中藝術學會

2007 Founded by Justin Li

Close ties with the PRC Embassy

2010: CCAA organized an event for PRC Embassy & Canada's Foreign Affairs to celebrate the 40th anniversary of Canada-China relations. Attendees included Justin Trudeau (MP at the time), his mother Margaret, his brother Sacha, Sacha's wife Zoe Bedos Trudeau as well as senior politicians from all major political parties.

JL & MS obtained approval of their marriage from JL's foreign affairs boss Wang Guangya (王光亚) & his wife Shanshan Chen (陈珊珊)

Wang later became PRC's Deputy Foreign Minister

Chen is the daughter of Chen Yi (陈毅), a top CCP leader & a PLA Marshal. He was PRC's Vice Premier (1954~1972) & Foreign Minister (1958~1972)

Baozhan Zhao 赵宝珍

JL's step-mother
CCP member

PRC Ambassador to Madagascar & Comoros (1994-1998), & to Cote d'Ivoire (1999-2003)

Xiaoyan Lou 楼小燕

JL's mother
CCP member

PRC diplomat at PRC Embassy in France & Australia
Translator for top CCP leaders including Zhou Enlai (周恩来) & Chen Yi (陈毅)

Peiyi Li 李培宜

JL's father
CCP member

PRC Ambassador to Togo (1985-1990) & Republic of Zaire (1990-1993)
Supported Tiananmen massacre when he was PRC ambassador to Togo

PRC Ministry of Foreign Affairs

PRC Embassy in Canada

JL is former director, Department of International Organizations and Conferences, PRC Ministry of Foreign Affairs
A graduate of China Foreign Affairs University, another cradle of PRC diplomats

Huawei Technologies

Founder Ren Zhengfei is a former PLA officer

Involved in the PRC's state surveillance programs
Required by PRC law to cooperate with intelligence agencies

Banned by many countries from their 5G networks
Fiasco of Meng Wanzhou & the two Michaels
